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Dear Licensee:

You were previously notified regarding the Board's decision to extend and/or delay certain licensing requirements due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This email serves as a reminder that the following requirements will take effect once the State of Emergency is lifted:

- The Board had previously delayed all 2020 renewals until 12/31/2020. While licensees who did not renew by that date are considered to have not timely renewed, their licenses were not cancelled. If a licensee who has not completed their 2020 renewal fails to renew their license **thirty (30) days** after the State of Emergency ends, the license will be cancelled and late fees will begin to accrue.
- The Board suspended application of 831 KAR 2:040 Section 11(5) and 831 KAR 2:040 Section 4(4), allowing licensees to complete the Kentucky Law and Report Writing courses through virtual and/or online means. The suspension of 831 KAR 2:040(11)(5) and 831 KAR 2:040(4)(4) will end **12/31/2021**.

NOTE: This is a generic email sent to all licensees. Check your KBHI eServices account to verify you have completed all necessary licensing requirements before the deadline dates. While the Board does not know when the State of Emergency will end, it recommends all licensees complete the above requirements as soon as possible, in the event it ends in the near future. The Board will send additional emails once the end date of the State of Emergency is announced.
